

**AGREEMENT FOR SECOND RENEWAL OF CONTRACT
BETWEEN DESOTO COUNTY AND
CLARKE ENVIRONMENTAL MOSQUITO MANAGEMENT,
INCORPORATED FOR
MOSQUITO CONTROL SERVICES
(PIGGYBACK CONTRACT)**

THIS AGREEMENT FOR THE SECOND RENEWAL (the “Renewal”) is made this _____ day of _____, 2026, between the **BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS, DESOTO COUNTY, FLORIDA**, a Political Subdivision of the State of Florida hereinafter referred to as (“COUNTY”) whose address is 201 E. Oak Street, Suite 201, Arcadia, Florida 34266; and **CLARKE ENVIRONMENTAL MOSQUITO MANAGEMENT, INCORPORATED**, a foreign profit corporation authorized to conduct business in the State of Florida (“CONTRACTOR”), whose FEI Number is 36-2391274.

WHEREAS, on March 21, 2024, the COUNTY entered into a contract with CONTRACTOR for the provision of mosquito control services (the “Agreement”) utilizing the agreement between CONTRACTOR and Okeechobee County which was competitively solicited (piggyback contract); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to section 3 of the Agreement, the term of the contract would be effective until such time as the master contract between the CONTRACTOR and Okeechobee County remained in effect; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the aforementioned terms of the Agreement, the COUNTY and CONTRACTOR entered into a First Renewal of the Agreement, extending the term through March 20, 2026; and

WHEREAS, on November 18, 2025, Okeechobee County renewed their contract with the CONTRACTOR for another one (1) year term for their Fourth Renewal; and

WHEREAS, the County being satisfied with the services of the CONTRACTOR wishes to renew Agreement with CONTRACTOR as more particularly set forth herein.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises, and in consideration of the mutual conditions, covenants, and obligations hereafter expressed, it is agreed as follows:

SECTION 1. INCORPORATION BY REFERENCE. The foregoing “Whereas” clauses are hereby incorporated by reference and affirmed and ratified by the parties as true.

SECTION 2. RENEWAL. The Agreement is hereby renewed for an additional one (1) year term through March 20, 2027.

SECTION 3. COMPENSATION. Upon the Effective Date of this Renewal, the below pricing shall control for the Services set forth in Exhibit A, with part IV and V application costs being billed when the treatment is completed in accordance with the below schedule:

 - 3. ULV particle size evaluation.
 - 4. Insecticide dosage and quality control analysis.

Any additional costs associated with activities and/or services that may be required by Clarke in order to comply with an NPDES permit are not included in this proposal.
