Commissioner Deriso said that he is praying daily for a low probability for storms this year with just the right amount of rain and not a lot of wind, so we can keep rebuilding and moving forward. Chairman Gross also thanked the staff for all they do and the directors for making the environment good for their staff.



Staff is requesting approval of a Contract Amendment with Hawkins, Inc. for Utilities' Purchase of Water and Wastewater Treatment Chemicals and adding 2 (two) additional chemicals, Sodium Hydroxide and Sodium Hypochlorite, to the Contract terms.

BACKGROUND:

On April 22, 2022, the County entered into a Contract with Hawkins, Inc. for the Utilities' Purchase of Water and Wastewater Chemicals to include Antiscalant and Ammonium Sulfate. This Contract was recently approved by the Board to be extended for another year through April 22, 2025. The Utilities Department has identified a need to secure a supplier for 2 (two) additional chemicals, Sodium Hydroxide and Sodium Hypochlorite, to ensure the proper maintenance of the Water and Wastewater Treatment. The Utilities Department sought out formal quotes from various suppliers in accordance with the County's Procurement Policy of which only 1 (one) formal Quotation Proposal was received - all other responses to our inquiries were unable to accommodate delivery to the necessary sites. Both the County and Seller desire to further amend this Contract by adding Sodium Hydroxide and Sodium Hypochlorite to the approved list of chemicals to be supplied by Hawkins, Inc. for the remainder of the current Contract year and all subsequent renewal periods allowable within the Contract terms.

Oak Street, Arcadia, Florida 34266 and HAWKINS, INCORPORATED a Corporation authorized to do business in the State of Florida, hereinafter referred to as ("SELLER"), whose address is 2263 Clark Street, Apopka, Florida 32703.

WHEREAS, a Contract was entered into on the 22nd day of April 2022, between COUNTY and SELLER for DeSoto County's Purchase of Water and Wastewater Treatment Chemicals; and

WHEREAS, the Contract was amended on April 22, 2024 utilizing the first **ONE (1)** year renewal extending the Contract to April 22, 2025; and

WHEREAS, the original Contract terms allow for the SELLER to provide Ammonium Sulfate and Antiscalant to the Utilities Department for maintenance of the Water and Wastewater Treatment; and

- A. To provide, at the request of CONTRACTOR, existing data, plans reports, and other information in the COUNTY'S possession or under the COUNTY'S control which are necessary for the execution of the duties of the CONTRACTOR in the Scope of Services; and to provide full information regarding requirements of the Scope of Services, including objectives, budget constraints, criteria and other requirements that exist at the time of signing of this Contract or which may develop during the execution of this Contract.
- **B.** To give prompt written notice to CONTRACTOR if the COUNTY observes or otherwise becomes aware of any fault or defect in the Scope of Services or non-conformance with the Contract requirements as stated herein.
- **C.** To furnish required information, services, render approvals, and decisions as expeditiously as necessary for the orderly progress of CONTRACTOR'S services.
- D. The COUNTY hereby designates the DeSoto County Engineer as Project Manager to act on the COUNTY'S behalf with respect to the Scope of Services. The Project Manager shall have authority to transmit instructions, receive information, interpret and define COUNTY policies and decisions with respect to materials, elements and systems pertinent to CONTRACTOR'S services.

SECTION 4. THE CONTRACTOR'S RESPONSIBILITY. The CONTRACTOR'S duties and responsibilities are as follows:

- A. The furnishing of all services, labor, material, equipment, tools, machinery, utilities, insurance and supplies necessary to perform the complete Scope of Services for Desoto County's Fiscal Year 2023/24 Annual Road Paving and Brewer Park Paving Project. The Work shall be performed in accordance with specifications, terms and conditions of this Contract, which are more particularly described in the Scope of Services.

SECTION 8. GENERAL CONSIDERATIONS.

- A. <u>Subcontractors.</u> If CONTRACTOR subcontracts any of the Work required under this Contract, CONTRACTOR agrees to include in the Subcontract that the Subcontractor is bound by the terms and conditions of this Contract with the COUNTY. CONTRACTOR further agrees to include in the Subcontracts, that the Subcontractor shall hold the COUNTY and CONTRACTOR harmless against all claims of whatever nature by Subcontractor's performance of Work under this Contract.
- B. <u>Public Records.</u> CONTRACTOR shall allow public access to all documents, reports, papers, letters or other materials, subject to the provision of Chapter 119,

- Florida Statutes, prepared or received by CONTRACTOR in conjunction with this Contract.
- C. Equal Employment and Non-Discrimination. In connection with the Work to be performed under this Contract, CONTRACTOR agrees to comply with the applicable provisions of State and Federal Equal Employment Opportunity Statutes and Regulations.
- D. <u>Contract Assurance.</u> The CONTRACTOR or Subcontractor shall not discriminate on the basis of race, color, national origin or sex in the performance of this Contract.
- E. <u>Licenses and Certifications.</u> The CONTRACTOR shall be properly certified and licensed; financially solvent; experienced in and competent to perform the required Work;

SECTION 9. PROHIBITION AGAINST CONTINGENCY FEES. CONTRACTOR warrants that it has not employed or retained any company or person, other than a bona fide employee working solely for CONTRACTOR to solicit or secure this Contract and that CONTRACTOR has not paid or agreed to pay any person, company, corporation, individual or firm, other than a bona fide employee working solely for CONTRACTOR, any fee, commission, percentage, gift or any other consideration contingent upon or resulting from the award or making of this Contract. For the breach or violation of this provision, the COUNTY shall have the right to terminate this Contract without liability, and at its discretion, to deduct from the contract price, or otherwise recover, the full amount of such fee, commission, percentage, gift or consideration.

SECTION 10. TRUTH-IN-NEGOTIATIONS/PUBLIC ENTITY CRIMES AFFIDAVIT. CONTRACTOR certifies that wage rates and other factual unit costs supporting the compensation are accurate, complete, and current at the time of contracting. The original Contract price and any additions thereto shall be adjusted to exclude any significant sums by which the COUNTY determines the contract price was increased due to inaccurate, incomplete, or non-current wage rates and other factual unit costs. CONTRACTOR represents that he has furnished a Public Entity Crimes Affidavit pursuant to Section 287.113, Florida Statutes.

SECTION 11. INSURANCE.

A. The CONTRACTOR shall provide and maintain such Commercial (Occurrence Form) or Comprehensive General Liability, Professional Liability, Workers Compensation and other insurance as is appropriate for the services being performed hereunder by CONTRACTOR, its employees or agents. The amounts and types of insurance shall conform to the following minimum requirements:

1. WORKERS' COMPENSATION:

Coverage is to apply for all employees for statutory limits in compliance with the applicable state and federal laws. The policy must include Employers' Liability with a limit of \$500,000 each accident, \$500,000 each employee, \$500,000 policy limit for disease.

2. <u>COMMERCIAL GENERAL LIABILITY - OCCURRENCE FORM REQUIRED:</u>

Contractor shall maintain Commercial General Liability (CGL) Insurance with a limit of not less than \$500,000 each occurrence. If such CGL insurance contains a general aggregate limit, it shall apply separately to this location/project in the amount of \$1,000,000. Products and completed operations aggregate shall be \$1,000,000. CGL insurance shall be written on an occurrence form and shall include bodily injury and property damage liability for premises, operations, independent contractors, products and completed operations, contractual liability, broad form property damage and property damage resulting from explosion, collapse or underground (x, c, u) exposures, personal injury and advertising.

3. COMMERCIAL AUTOMOBILE LIABILITY INSURANCE:

Contractor shall maintain automobile liability insurance with a limit of not less than \$1,000,000 each accident for bodily injury and property damage liability. Such insurance shall cover liability arising out of any auto (including owned, hired and non-owned autos). The policy shall be endorsed to provide contractual liability coverage.

4. **EVIDENCE OF INSURANCE:**

Contractor shall, at its sole cost and expense, procure and maintain throughout the term of this Contract, Comprehensive General Liability and Worker's Compensation Insurance, including Employer Liability Insurance, with minimum policy limits of \$1,000,000 Combined Single Limits, or to the extent and in such amounts as required and authorized by Florida Law, and will provide endorsed Certification of Insurance generated and executed by a licensed insurance broker, brokerage or similar licensed insurance professional evidencing such coverage, and naming the County as a named, additional insured, as well as furnishing the County with a Certified Copy, or Copies, of said insurance policies. Certificates of Insurance and Certified Copies of these Insurance Policies must accompany this signed Said insurance coverage(s) procured by the Contractor as required herein shall be considered, and the Contractor agrees that said insurance coverage(s) it procures as required herein shall be considered, as primary insurance over and above any other insurance, or selfinsurance, available to the County, and that any other insurance, or selfinsurance available to the County shall be considered secondary to, or in excess of, the insurance coverage(s) procured by the Contractor as required herein.

Nothing herein shall be construed to extend the County's liability beyond that provided in Section 768.28, Florida Statutes.

In the event the insurance coverage expires prior to the completion of the project, a renewal certificate shall be issued 30-days prior to said expiration date. The policy shall provide a 30-day notification clause in the event of cancellation or modification to the policy. All Certificates of Insurance must be on file with and approved by the County before the commencement of any work activities.

B. The required Certificates of Insurance not only shall name types of policies provided, but also shall refer specifically to this Contract. All the policies of insurance so required of CONTRACTOR, except workers compensation insurance, shall be endorsed to include as additional insures; the COUNTY, its officers, employees and agents

C. Insurance coverage shall be placed with insurers or self-insurance funds, satisfactory to the COUNTY, licensed to do business in the State of Florida and with a resident agent designated for the services of process. All insurers shall have an "A" policyholder's rating and a financial rating of at least Class IX in accordance with the most current Best's rating. CONTRACTOR shall provide the COUNTY with financial information concerning any self-insurance funds insuring CONTRACTOR. At the COUNTY'S option, a Best's rating or Self-Insurance Fund financial information may be waived.

SECTION 12. TERMINATION OF CONTRACT FOR DEFAULT. The COUNTY shall be the sole judge of nonperformance, which shall include any failure on the part of the CONTRACTOR to accept the award, to furnish required documents, and/or to fulfill any portion of this Contract within the time stipulated. Upon default by the CONTRACTOR to meet any term of this Contract or related Exhibit, the COUNTY will notify the CONTRACTOR to advise the COUNTY of its plan for corrective action to remedy the default within three (3) days (weekends and holidays excluded). The corrective action plan must be accepted by the COUNTY'S Project Manager. Failure on the CONTRACTOR'S part to correct the default within the approved time period shall result in the Contract being terminated and the COUNTY notifying in writing the CONTRACTOR of the effective date of the termination. The following shall constitute an act of default:

- Failure to perform the Work required under the Contract and/or within the time required or failing to use the sub-contractors, entities and personnel as identified and set forth, and to the degree specified in the Contract.
- Failure to begin the Work under this Contract within the time specified.
- Failure to perform the Work with sufficient workers to ensure timely completion.
- Neglecting or refusing to correct Work where prior Work has been rejected as nonconforming with the terms of the Contract.
- Becoming insolvent, being declared bankrupt by a US Bankruptcy Court, renders
 the successful firm incapable of performing the Work in accordance with and as
 required by the Contract.
- Failure to comply with any of the terms of the Contract.

 Failure to pay sub-contractors or others pursuant to Work done under this Contract.

In the event of default, the CONTRACTOR shall pay any damages sustained by the COUNTY including attorney's fees and court costs incurred in collecting any damages. Title to all materials, work-in-progress, and completed but undelivered goods will pass to the COUNTY after costs are claimed and allowed. All documents prepared by the CONTRACTOR in connection with this Contract will be the property of the COUNTY.

The COUNTY'S Project Manager shall authorize payment to the CONTRACTOR, the costs and expenses for Work performed by the CONTRACTOR prior to receipt of the Notice of Termination; however, the COUNTY may withhold from amounts due the CONTRACTOR such sums as the Administrative Services Director deems to be necessary to protect the COUNTY against loss caused by the CONTRACTOR because of the default.

<u>SECTION 13</u>. TERMINATION FOR CONVENIENCE. The COUNTY reserves the right to cancel this Contract by written notice to the CONTRACTOR effective the date specified in the Notice, for any of the following reasons:

- The COUNTY has determined that such cancellation will be in the best interest of the COUNTY.
- Funds are not available to cover the cost of the services. The COUNTY'S
 obligation is contingent upon the availability of appropriate funds.

The Purchasing Director shall give written notice of the termination to the CONTRACTOR specifying the reason for the Contract termination and when termination becomes effective.

The CONTRACTOR shall incur no further obligations in connection with the terminated Work and on the date set in the Notice of Termination the CONTRACTOR will stop Work to the extent specified.

The COUNTY shall pay the CONTRACTOR under the following conditions:

 All costs and expenses incurred by the CONTRACTOR for work accepted by the COUNTY prior to the CONTRACTOR'S receipt of the Notice of Termination.

Anticipatory profit for work and services not performed by the CONTRACTOR shall not be allowed.

SECTION 14: LIQUIDATED DAMAGES:

For all Contracts, regardless of whether the Contract time is stipulated in calendar days or working days, the COUNTY will count default days in calendar days. If the CONTRACTOR or, in case of his default, the Surety, fails to complete the work within the time stipulated in the Contract, or within such extra time that the COUNTY may have granted the CONTRACTOR or, in case of his default, the Surety shall pay to the COUNTY, not as a penalty, but as liquidated damages, in the amount of **ONE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$1,000.00)** per calendar day after final completion.

The COUNTY has the right to apply, as payment on such liquidated damages, any money the COUNTY owes the CONTRACTOR.

The County does not waive its right to liquidated damages due under the Contract by allowing the CONTRACTOR to continue and finish the work, or any part of it, after the expiration of the Contract Time including granted time extension.

In case of default of the Contract and completion of the work by the COUNTY, the CONTRACTOR and his Surety are liable for the liquidated damages under the Contract, but the COUNTY will not charge liquidated damages for any delay in the final completion of the COUNTY'S performance of the work due to any unreasonable action or delay on the part of the COUNTY.

The COUNTY considers the Contract complete when the CONTRACTOR has completed all work and the COUNTY has accepted the work. The COUNTY will then release the CONTRACTOR from further obligation except as set forth in his bond.

<u>SECTION 15.</u> CONTROLLING LAW.

- **A.** This Contract is to be governed by the laws of the State of Florida. The venue for any litigation resulting out of this Contract shall be in DeSoto County, Florida.
- **B.** Should litigation be necessary to enforce any term or provision of this Contract, or to collect any portion of the amount payable under this Contract, then all litigation and collection expenses, witness fees, court costs and attorney's fees shall be paid to the prevailing party.

<u>SECTION 16.</u> SUCCESSORS AND ASSIGNS. The COUNTY and CONTRACTOR respectively, bind themselves, their partners, successors, assigns and legal representatives to the other party to this Contract and to the partners, successors, assigns and legal representatives with respect to all covenants of this Contract. Neither the COUNTY nor CONTRACTOR shall assign or transfer any interest in this Contract without the written consent of the other.

SECTION 17. EXTENT OF CONTRACT.

- **A.** This Contract represents the entire and integrated agreement between the COUNTY and CONTRACTOR and supersedes all prior negotiations, representations or Contracts, either written or oral.
- **B.** This Contract may only be amended, supplemented, modified, changed or canceled by a duly executed written instrument and in accordance with County Policies.

SECTION 18. INDEMNIFICATION OF THE COUNTY. CONTRACTOR shall defend, indemnify and hold harmless the COUNTY and all of COUNTY'S officers, agents, and employees from and against all claims, liability, loss and expense, including reasonable costs, collection expenses, attorney's fees, and court costs which may arise because of the negligence (whether active or passive), misconduct, or other fault, in whole or in part (whether joint, concurrent, or contributing), of CONTRACTOR, its officers, agents or employees in performance or non-performance of its obligations under the Contract. CONTRACTOR recognizes the broad nature of this indemnification and hold harmless clause, as well as the provision of a legal defense to the COUNTY when necessary, and voluntarily makes this covenant and expressly acknowledges the receipt of such good and valuable consideration provided by the COUNTY in support of these indemnification, legal defense and hold harmless contractual obligations in accordance with the laws of the State of Florida. This clause shall survive the termination of this Contract. Compliance with any insurance requirements required elsewhere within this Contract shall not relive CONTRACTOR of its liability and obligation to defend, hold harmless and indemnify the COUNTY as set forth in this article of the Contract.

<u>SECTION 19.</u> INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR. Neither the COUNTY nor any of its employees shall have any control over the conduct of CONTRACTOR or any of CONTRACTOR'S employees, except as herein set forth. CONTRACTOR expressly warrants not to represent at any time or in any manner that CONTRACTOR or any of its agents, servants or employees are agents, servants or employees of the COUNTY. It is understood and agreed that CONTRACTOR is, and shall at all times remain as to the COUNTY, a wholly independent Contractor and the CONTRACTOR'S obligations to the COUNTY are solely as prescribed by this Contract.

SECTION 20. SEVERABILITY.

- A. Nothing contained in the Contract shall create any contractual relationship between the COUNTY, or any agent, consultant, or independent contractor employed by the COUNTY and any Subcontractor, Sub-subcontractor, Supplier or Vendor of the CONTRACTOR, but the COUNTY shall be entitled to performance of all obligations intended for its benefit, and to enforcement thereof.
- **B.** In the event any one or more of the provisions contained in this Contract shall for any reason be held invalid, illegal, or unenforceable in any respect; the invalidity, illegality, or unenforceability shall not affect any other provision and this Contract and shall be construed as if the invalid, illegal, or unenforceable provision had never been contained in it.
- **C.** All representations, certifications, statements contained in CONTRACTOR'S bid submittal are true and accurate and are incorporated by reference herein.

<u>SECTION 21.</u> NOTICES. Any notices to be given under this Contract shall be given by the United States mail, addressed to CONTRACTOR at its address stated herein, and to the COUNTY at its address stated herein.

GENERAL CONDITIONS

BIDDER: To insure acceptance of the bid, follow these instructions.

- ACCEPTANCE: Items may be tested for compliance with specifications. Items delivered not
 conforming to specifications may be rejected and returned at Contractor's expense. Any increase
 in cost for items not delivered as specified in the solicitation may be charged against the
 Contractor.
- **2. AMENDMENTS:** No amendment, modification or supplement to the Contract shall be binding unless it is in writing and signed by an authorized representative of both parties.
- **3. APPLICABLE LAW:** This Contract shall be governed in all respects by the laws of the State of Florida, and any litigation with respect thereto shall be brought in the Courts of the State of Florida.
- 4. AS-BUILT DRAWINGS: If this solicitation requires as-built drawings, the Contractor must supply three sets of certified as-built drawings upon completion of the project at the Contractors' expense. All sets submitted to the County must be certified by a professionally licensed engineering firm authorized to do business in the State of Florida. All drawings, specifications, and copies thereof furnished by the County are the property of the County. They are not to be used on other work and, with the exception of the signed contract set, are to be returned to the County upon the completion of the work.
- 5. **ASSIGNMENT:** The Contractor shall not assign, transfer, convey, sublet, or otherwise dispose of any award or any or all of its rights, title, or interest therein, without the prior written consent of the County. Assignment or transfer of the resulting Contract without written consent of the County may be construed by the County as a breach of contract sufficient to cancel this Contract at the discretion of the County.
- 6. AVAILABILITY OF FUNDING: Award of this solicitation is contingent upon availability of funding. Furthermore, during the contract period, if funding to finance all or part of the award resulting from this solicitation becomes unavailable, the County reserves the right to terminate such Contract after providing the Vendor no less than twenty-four (24) hours written notice. The County shall be the final authority as to the determination of availability of funding. The County agrees to reimburse the Contractor for any authorized goods or services provided prior to the Contractor's receipt of the aforesaid termination notice.
- **7. AWARD:** It is the intent of the County to award a Contract to the lowest responsive and responsible Bidder, provided that the low bid does not exceed the funds available. The Base Bid and any Add Alternates must be bid for the bid to be considered responsive.
 - A. Within Available Funds: If the lowest Base Bid received is within the funds currently budgeted for this project, the Add Alternates, if any, will be applied in the order shown on the Bid Form prior to the determination of the lowest responsive and responsible Bid. If the Base Bid plus the Add Alternates, if any, is within the funds currently budgeted for this project, this bidder will be deemed the lowest bidder. The Add Alternates will be added until the funds currently available are met.
 - B. Exceeds Available Funds: If the lowest Base Bid received exceeds the funds currently

budgeted for this project, the Add Alternates, if any, will not be considered. In this case a recommendation will be made using the budgeted base bid and proceed with the Contract award.

- 8. BID BOND: In submitting this sealed bid it is understood that the right is reserved by the DeSoto County Board of County Commissioners to reject any or all bids. It is agreed that this Bid may not be withdrawn for ninety (90) days from opening. Bids which are withdrawn will result in forfeiture of the bid bond, if any. THERE WILL BE NO BID BOND REQUIRED FOR THIS PROJECT.
- **9. BID PROTEST POLICY:** Any person whose bid or proposal is rejected, in whole or in part, or who submits a bid or proposal but is not awarded the Agreement may protest such decision, but only in strict compliance with this Section.

A. BID PROTEST PROCEDURE:

- **a.** WRITTEN NOTICE; TIME. Any person who wishes to file a bid protest hereunder must file a notice of intent to do so, in writing, with the Purchasing Director within twenty-four (24) hours after receipt of the notice of rejection, for rejected bids or proposals, or, for contract awards, within twenty-four (24) hours after the County's declaration of its intention with regard to such award.
- **WRITTEN PROTEST; TIME; CONTENTS.** Within ten (10) days after filing the written notice of intent to protest, a formal written protest must be filed with the Purchasing Director, explaining in detail the nature of the protest and the grounds upon which it is based.
- c. <u>PROTEST BOND.</u> Each written protest must be accompanied by a bid protest bond in the form of a certified check, cashier's check or money order made payable to the DeSoto County Board of County Commissioners, in an amount not less than five percent (5%) of the protester's bid, or (in the case of submission of a "no-bid" by the protestor) in the amount not less than five percent (5%) of the lowest responsible bid received by the County, or (in the case of a request for proposals) in the amount of not less than five percent (5%) of the contract awarded by the County for the accepted proposal.
- **d. FORFEIT OF BOND.** The condition of the protest bond shall be that, should the protest be determined to be without merit and non-valid, the bond shall be forfeited to the County in its entirety.

B. BID PROTEST CONSIDERATION:

- a. PROTEST DECISION. Upon receipt of a formal written protest, the Purchasing Director shall forward such written protest to the County Attorney, who shall act as the bid protest Director, and who shall be provided all applicable documents and files. The County Attorney shall decide the protest, provided in writing, to the County Administrator and Purchasing Director, with findings of fact and a conclusion as to the validity or non-validity of the protest, within fourteen (14) days after receipt by the County Attorney of the formal written protest.
- **b. NOTICE OF DECISION.** Within twenty-four (24) hours after receipt of the County Attorney's decision on a protest, the Purchasing Director shall mail a copy thereof to the protestor.

- 10. CONTRACTOR OBLIGATIONS: Contractor agrees to perform and complete the service described in the solicitation in accordance with the work requirements of this Contract and attached exhibits. Contractor shall furnish all labor, supervision, equipment, and materials for the service. Experienced, qualified supervisors of the Contractor are essential to the satisfactory performance of the work. The County may consider lack of competent capable supervision as grounds to reject a bid or terminate this Contract. An experienced, qualified supervisor should have approximately two years of experience and one-year of supervisory experience doing the type of work requested in this solicitation. The County reserves the right to determine supervisory competence. Supervisors must be able to communicate fluently in English and in any language that crew members use to communicate.
- 11. COMPLETE AGREEMENT: The parties agree that the conditions of purchase stated herein or attachments hereto set forth their entire Contract and there are no promises or understandings other than those stated herein, and that any prior negotiations between the County and Contractor or terms or conditions of sales set forth in the Contractor's quotation or order or sales acknowledgement shall not constitute a part of the Contract between the County and Contractor concerning this purchase. The term "Contract" as used in this clause shall include any future written amendments, modifications, or supplements made in accordance herewith.
- 12. COMPLIANCE: A submission of a bid shall constitute an incontrovertible representation by a Bidder that the Bidder has complied with every requirement herein, and that without exception the bid is premised upon performing the work required by the Contract Documents with such means, methods, techniques, sequences, or procedures of construction as may be indicated in or required by the Contract Documents, and that the Contract Documents are sufficient in scope and detail to indicate and convey understanding of all terms and conditions for performance of the Work.
- 13. COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS: Contractor represents and warrants that the performance of this order and the furnishing of goods or services required shall be in accordance with the applicable standards, provisions, and stipulations of all pertinent Federal, State or County laws, rules, regulations, resolutions, and ordinances including but not limited to the Fair Labor Standards Act, the Equal Employment Opportunity rules and regulations, the Transportation Safety Act and the Occupational Safety and Health Acts.
- 14. CONDITION: It is understood and agreed that any item offered or shipped as a result of this solicitation shall be the latest model in current production and shall be of good quality, workmanship and material. All containers shall be suitable for storage or shipment; and all prices shall include standard commercial packaging. By signing the Bid Form the Bidder represents that all equipment offered under these specifications shall meet or exceed the minimum requirements specified.
- **15. CONFLICT OF INTEREST:** The award hereunder is subject to Chapter 112, Florida Statutes. All Bidders must disclose with their bid the name of any officer, director, or agent who is also an employee of DeSoto County. Further, all Bidders must disclose the name of any DeSoto County employee who owns, directly or indirectly, an interest of five percent (5%) or more of the Bidder's firm or any of its branches.
- **16. CHANGE ORDERS:** A Change Order is a written order to the Contractor signed by the County or their authorized agent issued after the execution of the Contract, authorizing a change in the

Project or the method or manner of performance, an adjustment in the Contract Price and/or Completion Date. Each adjustment in the Contract Price resulting from a Change Order shall require a revised Cost Breakdown signed by the County and the Contractor, resulting in the revised Contract Price upon acceptance of the Change Order.

The County shall have the right to make changes in the drawings, design, or specifications if within the general scope of the Contract. All such Changes in the Project Contract Price and/or Completion Date shall be authorized by Change Order issued by the County and will be adjusted accordingly and executed by the County and Contractor before proceeding with any changes in the Contract.

Concealed conditions encountered in the performance of the Work below the surface of the ground or should concealed or unknown conditions in an existing structure be at variance with the conditions indicated by the Drawings, Specifications, or County furnished information or should unknown physical conditions below the surface of the ground or should concealed or unknown conditions in an existing structure of an unusual nature, differing materially from those ordinarily encountered and generally recognized as inherent in work of the character provided for in this Contract be encountered, the Contract Price and the Construction Completion Date shall be equitably adjusted by Change Order upon claim by either party made within a reasonable time after the first observance of the conditions.

All documents submitted by the Contractor requiring response from the County which affect the Contractor's approved construction schedule are to be submitted at least 7 calendar days prior to the time needed. This pertains to Submittals, RFIs and Change orders. Within 7 days, the County will respond, approve, reject or request revisions/additional information as appropriate.

The Contractor must submit a request for Change Order for any work outside the contracted scope BEFORE the work is performed. The Contractor may only receive additional payment for work outside the contracted scope if a written Change Order is fully executed by the County prior to the work being performed. Any work performed without an approved Change Order will not be paid for by the County.

The County has assigned the following authority levels for Change Order dollar amounts and Contract Time extensions. The County Administrator or Delegate may approve all Change Orders less than Twenty-Five Thousand dollars (\$25,000.00). All Change Orders which exceed Twenty-Five Thousand dollars (\$25,000.00) require approval by the Board of County Commissioners. In cases where a change order requires board action, the review period is subject to the BOCC schedule.

If there is a dispute between the County and Contractor as to whether an instruction or directive constitutes a change, it is specifically agreed that neither Contractor's performance nor County's direction shall:

- **A.** Prejudice either party's rights to claim that such directive does or does not constitute a change.
- **B.** Limit the amount, if any, of adjustment in the Contract price called for by such change.
- **C.** Serve to determine whether or to what extent the Contractor is entitled to additional time for performance under the Contract.

If any such change caused an increase or decrease in the cost of, or the time required for the performance of any part of the work there under, an equitable adjustment shall be made to the Contract price or performance schedule.

- 17. CONTRACTOR'S OWN FORCES: No more than seventy-five percent (75%) of the dollar value of the total contract work may be accomplished by subcontractors. Balance of the work must be accomplished by successful Bidder's own forces. Each Bidder must furnish with its Bid Form, a list of the items it proposes to subcontract and the estimated cost of these items.
- 18. DELAYS AND EXTENSION OF TIME: The Contractor shall not be entitled to any claim for damages including loss of profits, loss of use, overhead expenses, equipment rental, etc., because of hindrances or delays for any cause whatsoever, but if occasioned by an act of God, or by any act or omission on the part of the County. County's agents or governmental agencies having jurisdiction, such act, hindrance or delay may entitle the Contractor to an extension of time in which to complete the work, which shall be determined by the County, provided that the Contractor will give written notice within two (2) weeks as provided herein of the cause of such act, hindrance, or delay. An extension of Contract Time shall be the Contractor's sole and exclusive remedy for all claims for delay, including delays attributable to breach of Contract or tort. However, the Contract Time will NOT be extended past the completion date stipulated in the County's Grant Agreement, if there is a Grant associated with the Work.

If any emergency or natural disaster causes delay or interferes with the use or delivery of the products/services described in this solicitation, the County reserves the right to acquire from other sources any products/services during any suspension of delivery.

- **19. DIRECT PURCHASE:** The County reserves the right, at the County's sole option, to utilize the Purchasing Department's direct purchasing ordering system. Direct purchase orders may be issued for applicable supplies and equipment to be utilized in the County's solicitations in order to recover applicable sales tax on these purchase orders.
- **20. DISPUTES:** In case of any doubt or differences of opinion as to the items to be furnished hereunder, the decision of the DeSoto County Board of County Commissioners shall be final.
- **21. DISQUALIFICATION:** More than one bid from an individual, firm, partnership, corporation or association under the same or different names will not be considered. If the County believes the Bidder is interested in more than one bid for the work contemplated, all bids in which such Bidder is interested in shall be rejected. If the County believes collusion exists among Bidders, all bids shall be rejected.
- **22. DOCUMENT CONFLICTS:** In the event of inconsistency between the Drawings and Specifications or within either the Drawings or Specifications not clarified by addendum, the better quality or the greater quantity of work shall be provided in accordance with the COUNTY'S interpretation.
- **23. ERROR IN EXTENSION:** If the unit price and the extension price are at variance, the unit price shall prevail.
- **24. E-VERIFY:** Contractor shall utilize the U.S. Department of Homeland Security's E-Verify system to confirm the employment eligibility of all persons employed by the Contractor during the term of

this Contract in which the Contractor performs employment duties within Florida. This verification requirement extends to all persons, including subcontractors, utilized, hired, contracted or assigned by the Contractor to perform work pursuant to this Contract.

- **25. EXAMINATION OF CONTRACT DOCUMENTS AND SITE:** It is the responsibility of each Bidder before submitting a bid to:
 - **A.** Examine the Contract Documents thoroughly,
 - **B.** Visit the site to become more familiar with local conditions that may affect cost, progress or performance of the work,
 - **C.** Consider Federal, State and local Laws and Regulations that may affect cost, progress or performance of the work,
 - **D.** Study and carefully correlate the Bidder's observations with the Contract Documents and,
 - **E.** Notify the County of all conflicts, errors, or discrepancies in the Contract Documents.

Information and data reflected in the Contract Documents with respect to underground utilities at or contiguous to the site is based upon information and data furnished to the County by underground utilities companies or others, and the County does not assume responsibility for the accuracy or completeness thereof unless it is expressly provided otherwise.

The Contractor shall verify and familiarize themselves with the lands upon which the work is to be performed, rights-of-way and easements for access thereto and other lands designated for use by the Contractor in performing the work and identified in the Contract Documents. All additional lands and access thereto required for temporary construction facilities or storage of materials and equipment are to be provided by the Contractor. Easements for permanent structures or changes in existing structures are to be obtained by the County unless otherwise provided in the Contract Documents.

- **26. FAILURE TO PERFORM:** If, during the term of the Contract, the Contractor should refuse or otherwise fail to perform any of its obligations under the Contract, the County reserves the right to:
 - A. Obtain the goods or services from another Contractor; and/or
 - B. Terminate the Contract; and/or
 - **C.** Suspend the Contractor from bidding for a period of up to 24 months.
- **27. INCURRED COST:** DeSoto County is not liable for any cost incurred by the Contractor prior to award. Costs for developing a response to this solicitation are entirely the obligation of the Bidder and shall not be chargeable in any manner to DeSoto County.
- 28. INDEMNIFICATION: Contractor shall defend, indemnify and hold harmless the County and all of County's officers, agents, and employees from and against all claims, liability, loss and expense, including reasonable costs, collection expenses, attorney's fees, and court costs which may arise because of the negligence (whether active or passive), misconduct, or other fault, in whole or in part (whether joint, concurrent, or contributing), of Contractor, its officers, agents or employees in performance or non-performance of its obligations under the Contract. Contractor recognizes the broad nature of this indemnification and hold harmless clause, as well as the provision of a legal

defense to the County when necessary, and voluntarily makes this covenant and expressly acknowledges the receipt of such good and valuable consideration provided by the County in support of these indemnification, legal defense and hold harmless contractual obligations in accordance with the laws of the State of Florida. This clause shall survive the termination of this Contract. Compliance with any insurance requirements required elsewhere within this Contract shall not relive Contractor of its liability and obligation to defend, hold harmless and indemnify the County as set forth in this article of the Contract.

Nothing herein shall be construed to extend the County's liability beyond that provided in Section 768.28, Florida Statutes.

- 29. INFORMALITIES AND IRREGULARITIES: The County has the right to waive minor defects or violations of a bid from exact requirements of the specifications that do not affect the price, quality, quantity, delivery, or performance time of the services being procured. If insufficient information is submitted by a Bidder with the bid for the County to properly evaluate the bid, the County has the right to require such additional information as it may deem necessary after the time set for receipt of bids, provided that such concession does not affect the price, quality, quantity, delivery, or performance time of the goods/services being procured.
- **30. INSPECTION:** All goods and services shall be subject to inspection and approval by the County at all reasonable times including inspection during manufacture. Inspection and approval by the County at Contractor's plant does not preclude rejection for defects upon discovery by subsequent inspection. Any goods and services rejected by the County shall be promptly repaired or replaced at Contractor's expense. Any and all costs incurred by the County in connection with the return of goods rejected by the County as defective shall be at Contractor's risk and expense.
- **31. INSURANCE:** The Contractor, at its own expense and in its own name must provide and keep in force during the term of this Contract, insurance coverage provided by a (a) company(s) licensed to conduct business in the State of Florida acceptable to the County with limits not less than indicated for the respective items or as otherwise agreed. Types of coverage and limits of liability shall be as set forth in the Special Conditions.

If any insurance should be cancelled or changed by the insured or expire during the period of its bid award, the Contractor shall be responsible for securing other acceptable insurance to provide the coverage specified in the solicitation to maintain continuous coverage during the life of the award.

- **32. LEGAL REQUIREMENTS:** Federal, State, County and local laws, ordinances, rules and regulations that in any manner affect the item(s) covered herein apply. Lack of knowledge by the Bidder will no way be cause for relief from responsibility.
- 33. LICENSE/CERTIFICATIONS: The successful Contractor will be required to secure, at its expense, the proper occupational license and/or any other license/certification required of the applicable service/work being performed. Proof of license and/or certification may be required prior to bid award. The Bidder shall fully comply with all state and federal laws, County procurement policies, ordinances and regulations in any manner affecting the performance of the work. The Bidder shall provide its occupation license number and expiration date.
- 34. LIENS: Before the final draw is payable, Contractor must furnish a sworn statement that all sums

due for services, material or labor on the project have been paid in full. If the County receives any Notice to Owner on this Project, then in addition to the requirements set forth above, Contractor shall at the time of each draw furnish a partial waiver of lien from all subcontractors, material or labor providers, and at the time of the final draw shall furnish a final waiver of lien for each such subcontractor, material or labor provider; as a condition precedent to receiving any payment from the County. Contractor shall indemnify the County and hold it harmless from and against any loss or damage, claim or cause of action, and any attorneys' fees and court costs, arising out of: any unpaid bills for labor, services or materials furnished to this project; any failure of performance of Contractor under this Contract; or the negligence of the Contractor in the performance of its duties under this Contract, or any act or omission on part of the Contractor, his agents, employees, or servants.

The Contractor may, if any subcontractor refuses to furnish a release or receipt in full, furnish a bond satisfactory to the Purchasing Officer, to indemnify the County against any lien. If any lien remains unsatisfied after all payments are made, the Contractor shall refund to the County all moneys that the latter may be compelled to pay in discharging such a lien, including all costs and a reasonable attorney's fee.

- 35. LIQUIDATED DAMAGES: For all Contracts, regardless of whether the Contract time is stipulated in calendar days or working days, the County will count default days in calendar days. If the Contractor or, in case of his default, the Surety, fails to complete the work within the time stipulated in the Contract, or within such extra time that the County may have granted the Contractor or, in case of his default, the Surety shall pay to the County, not as a penalty, but as liquidated damages, the following amounts according to Contractor's Bid amount:
 - \$50,000.00 \$100.00 per calendar day.
 - \$50,000.00 to \$500,000.00 \$250.00 per calendar day.
 - \$500,000.00 to 1 Million \$500.00 per calendar day.
 - Over 1 Million \$1,000.00 per calendar day.

The County has the right to apply, as payment on such liquidated damages, any money the County owes the Contractor.

The County does not waive its right to liquidated damages due under the Contract by allowing the Contractor to continue and finish the work, or any part of it, after the expiration of the Contract Time including granted time extension.

In case of default of the Contract and completion of the work by the County, the Contractor and his Surety are liable for the liquidated damages under the Contract, but the County will not charge liquidated damages for any delay in the final completion of the County's performance of the work due to any unreasonable action or delay on the part of the County.

The County considers the Contract complete when the Contractor has completed all work and the County has accepted the work. The County will then release the Contractor from further obligation except as set forth in his bond, if any.

36. LITIGATION VENUE: All litigation shall take place either in the State Courts of Florida, wherein

venue shall lie in Desoto County, Florida; or in the Federal Courts, wherein venue shall lie in the Central District in and for the State of Florida. The Contractor expressly waives venue in any other location.

- **37. LOCAL PREFERENCE POLICY:** DeSoto County has recently adopted a Local Preference Policy. A brief explanation and Affidavit is included in this Invitation to Bid. This Affidavit must be included in your Bid Packet to claim Local Preference. To review the complete Policy, you can access the information at www.desotobocc.com/administration/purchasing.
- **38. MISTAKES:** Bidders are expected to examine the specifications, delivery schedules, bid prices, and all instructions pertaining to supplies and services. Failure to do so will be at Bidder's risk.
- **39. NONCONFORMING TERMS AND CONDITIONS:** A bid response that includes terms and conditions that do not conform to the terms and conditions in the solicitation are subject to rejection as nonresponsive. The County reserves the right to permit the Bidder to withdraw nonconforming terms and conditions from its bid response prior to determination by the County of nonresponsiveness based on the submission of nonconforming terms and conditions.
- 40. NON-EXCLUSIVE CONTRACT: Award of this Contract shall impose no obligation on the County to utilize the Contractor for all work of this type, which may develop during the contract period. This is not an exclusive Contract. The County specifically reserves the right to concurrently contract with other companies for similar work if it deems such action to be in the County's best interest.
- 41. OPERATION DURING DISPUTE: In the event the County has not cancelled the Contract in accordance with the terms of the Contract, and there remains a dispute with the Contractor and the County, the Contractor agrees to continue to operate and perform under the terms of the Contract while such dispute is pending, and further agrees that, in the event a suit is filed for injunction or other relief, it will continue to operate until the final adjudication of such suit by the Court.
- **42. PAYMENT BOND:** In submitting this sealed bid it is understood that the DeSoto County Board of County Commissioners may require a Payment Bond to ensure payments are made to all person supplying labor or material for the completion of work under this Contract.
- 43. PAYMENT TERMS: Contractor shall prepare and submit to the Board of County Commissioners for approval, invoices for the services rendered under this Contract. Invoices for services shall be paid in accordance with the Florida Prompt Payment Act, found in Part VII, Ch. 218, Florida Statutes. All invoices shall be accompanied by a report identifying the nature and progress of the work performed. The statement shall show a summary of fees with an accrual of the total fees billed and credits for portions paid previously. The County reserves the right to withhold payment to Contractor for failure to perform the work in accordance with the provisions of this Contract and the County shall promptly notify Contractor if any invoice or report is found to be unacceptable and will specify the reasons.
- **44. PERFORMANCE BOND:** In submitting this sealed bid it is understood that the DeSoto County Board of County Commissioners may require a Performance Bond to protect the County from any and all losses due to the awarded Contractor's inability to complete the Contract as agreed.

- **45. PERIOD OF OFFER VALIDITY:** Prices quoted must remain firm for a period of ninety (90) days from the bid opening date.
- **46. PERMITS:** The Contractor will secure and pay for all construction permits and licenses and will pay all governmental charges and inspection fees necessary for the prosecution of the work, which are applicable at the time of the solicitation. When such charges are normally made by the County and when so stated in the Contract Documents, there will be no charges to the Contractor. The County shall assist the Contractor, when necessary, in obtaining such permits and licenses. The Contractor will also pay all public utility charges.
- **47. PRE-BID MEETING:** If the Contract Documents state the Pre-Bid Meeting is MANDATORY, you must attend this meeting. No Bids will be accepted if you do not attend.
- **48. PUBLIC RECORDS REQUESTS:** If the Contractor [Consultant] has questions regarding the application of Chapter 119, Florida Statutes, to the Contractor's [Consultant's] duty to provide public records relating to this Contract, contact the Agency's custodian of public records at the DeSoto County Administration Building, 201 East Oak Street, Arcadia, Florida 34266, (863) 993-4800.
 - **A.** Contractor [Consultant] must keep and maintain all public records required by the Agency in order to perform services under this Contract.
 - **B.** Upon request from the Agency's custodian of public records, Contractor [Consultant] shall provide the Agency with a copy of the requested public records or allow the records to be inspected or copied within a reasonable time at a cost that does not exceed the cost provide in Chapter 119, Florida Statutes, or as otherwise provided by law.
 - C. Contractor [Consultant] shall ensure that public records that are exempt or confidential and exempt from public records disclosure requirements are not disclosed except as authorized by law for the duration of the contract term and following completion of the contract if the Contractor [Consultant] does not transfer the records to the Agency.
 - D. Upon completion of the contract, Contractor [Consultant] shall transfer, at no cost, to the Agency all public records in the possession of the Contractor [Consultant], or keep and maintain public records required by the Agency to perform the service under this contract. If the Contractor [Consultant] transfers all public records to the Agency upon completion of the contract, the Contractor [Consultant] shall destroy any duplicate public records that are exempt or confidential and exempt from public records disclosure requirements. If the Contractor [Consultant] keeps and maintains public records upon completion of the contract, the Contractor [Consultant] shall meet all applicable requirements for retaining public records. All records stored electronically must be provided to the Agency, upon request from the Agency's custodian of public records, in a format that is compatible with the information technology systems of the Agency.
- **49. PURCHASING AGREEMENTS WITH OTHER GOVERNMENT AGENCIES:** This solicitation may be extended to include other governmental agencies provided a cooperative Purchasing Agreement exists. Each political entity will be responsible for the execution of its own requirements with the awarded Contractor.
- **50. RETAINAGE:** The Contract retainage amount with respect to the progress payments shall be 10%

- unless otherwise stated in the Contract Documents. The County, at its sole discretion, may allow for a reduction of retainage dependent on work progress and status.
- 51. RIGHT TO AUDIT RECORDS: In performance of this Contract, the Contractor shall keep books, records, and accounts of all activities related to the Contract, in compliance with generally accepted accounting procedures. All documents, papers, books, records and accounts made or received by the Contractor in conjunction with the Contract and the performance of this Contract shall be open to inspection during regular business hours by an authorized representative of the County.
- **52. RIGHT TO REJECT:** The DeSoto County Board of County Commissioners' reserves the right to reject any and all bids not deemed to be in the best interest of the County, or to accept that bid which appears to be the lowest most responsible bid which may not be in the best interest of the County. The County reserves the right to waive any and all informalities or reject any or all bids or any part of any bid. The County also reserves the right to award or eliminate any portion of the bid.
- **53. SAFETY AND PROTECTION:** The Contractor will be responsible for initiating, maintaining and supervising all safety precautions and programs in connection with the work. He will take all necessary precautions for the safety of, and will provide the necessary protection to prevent damage, injury or loss to:
 - **A.** All employees on the work site and other persons, who may be affected thereby,
 - **B.** All the work and all materials or equipment to be incorporated therein, whether in storage on or off the site, and
 - **C.** Other property at the site or adjacent thereto, including trees, shrubs, lawns, walks, pavement on roadways, structures and utilities not designated for removal, relocation or replacement in the course of construction.
 - **D.** The Contractor will designate a responsible member of his organization at the site whose duty shall be the prevention of accidents. This person shall be the Contractor's superintendent unless otherwise designated in writing by the Contractor to the County.
- **54. SILENCE OF SPECIFICATIONS:** The apparent silence of the specifications and any supplemental specifications as to any details or the omission from same of any detailed description concerning any point, shall be regarded as meaning that only the best commercial practices are to prevail and only materials of first quality be provided. All interpretations of this specification shall be made upon the basis of this statement.
- **55. STATEMENT RELATIVE TO PUBLIC ENTITY CRIMES:** The Bidder is directed to the Florida Public Entity Crime Act 287.133, Florida Statutes, and the County's requirement that the successful Bidder comply with it in all respects prior to and during the term of the Contract.
- **56. SUBMITTALS:** All Submittals, MOT, Project Schedule and any other pertinent information, if required of the project, must be provided by the awarded Contractor at the Project Kick-off Meeting or Notice to Proceed will not be issued. If the awarded Contractor fails to provide this information in a timely manner, the County will consider failure to provide these materials, grounds for Termination by Default.

- **57. TRAINING:** If specified, Contractor(s) may be required at the convenience of the County, to provide employees training in the operation and maintenance of any item(s) purchased from this solicitation.
- 58. TERMINATION FOR CONVENIENCE: The performance of work under the Contract may be terminated by the County in whole or in part whenever the County determines that termination is in the County's best interest. Any such termination shall be effected by the delivery to the Contractor of a written Notice of Termination at least ten (10) days before the date of termination, specifying the extent to which performance of the work under the Contract is terminated and the date upon which such termination becomes effective.

After receipt of a Notice of Termination, except as otherwise directed, the Contractor shall stop work on the date of receipt of the Notice of Termination or other date specified in the notice; place no further orders or subcontracts for materials, services, or facilities except as necessary for completion of such portion of the work not terminated; terminate all vendors and subcontractors; and settle all outstanding liabilities and claims.

- 59. TERMINATION FOR DEFAULT: The County shall be the sole judge of nonperformance, which shall include any failure on the part of the Contractor to accept the award, to furnish required documents, and/or to fulfill any portion of this Contract within the time stipulated. Upon default by the Contractor to meet any term of this Contract or related Exhibit, the County will notify the Contractor to advise the County of its plan for corrective action to remedy the default within three (3) days (weekends and holidays excluded). The corrective action plan must be accepted by the County. Failure on the Contractor's part to correct the default within the approved time period shall result in the Contract being terminated and the County, notifying in writing the Contractor of the effective date of the termination. The following shall constitute an act of default:
 - Failure to perform the Work required under the Contract and/or within the time required or failing to use the sub-contractors, entities, and personnel as identified and set forth, and to the degree specified in the Contract.
 - Failure to begin the Work under this Contract within the time specified.
 - Failure to perform the Work with sufficient workers to ensure timely completion.
 - Neglecting or refusing to correct Work where prior work has been rejected as nonconforming with the terms of the Contract.
 - Becoming insolvent, being declared bankrupt by a US Bankruptcy Court, renders the successful firm incapable of performing the Work in accordance with and as required by the Contract.
 - Failure to comply with any of the terms of the Contract.
 - Failure to pay sub-contractors or others pursuant to Work done under this Contract.

In the event of default, the Contractor shall pay any damages sustained by the County including attorney's fees and court costs incurred in collecting any damages. Title to all materials, work-in-progress, and completed but undelivered goods will pass to the County after costs are claimed and allowed. All documents prepared by the Contractor in connection with this Contract will be the property of the County.

The County Project Manager shall authorize payment to the Contractor, the costs and expenses for Work performed by the Contractor prior to receipt of the notice of termination; however, the County may withhold from amounts due the Contractor such sums as the Administrative Services Director deems to be necessary to protect the County against loss caused by the Contractor because of the default.

- **60. VERBAL INSTRUCTIONS:** No negotiations, decisions, or actions shall be initiated or executed by the Contractor as a result of any discussions with any County employee. Only those communications which are in writing from an authorized County representative may be considered. Only written communications from the Contractors personnel which are assigned by a person designated as authorized to bind the company will be recognized by the County as duly authorized expressions on behalf of the company.
- **61. WARRANTY CLAUSE:** A warranty is a guarantee of the integrity of a product and of the manufacturers' responsibility for the repair or placement. All manufacturer warranties are to be transferred to the County before final acceptance.
- **62. WORK HOURS:** In accordance with DeSoto County's Noise Ordinance 2011-11 work performed before 7:00 a.m. or after 10:00 p.m. is prohibited unless otherwise approved in advance.

NOTE: ANY AND ALL SPECIAL CONDITIONS ATTACHED HERETO WHICH MAY VARY FROM THE GENERAL CONDITIONS SHALL HAVE PRECEDENCE.

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SPECIAL CONDITIONS

1. INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS:

A. WORKERS' COMPENSATION:

Coverage is to apply for all employees for statutory limits in compliance with the applicable state and federal laws. The policy must include Employers' Liability with a limit of \$500,000 each accident, \$500,000 each employee, \$500,000 policy limit for disease.

B. COMMERCIAL GENERAL LIABILITY - OCCURRENCE FORM REQUIRED:

Contractor shall maintain Commercial General Liability (CGL) Insurance with a limit of not less than \$500,000 each occurrence. If such CGL insurance contains a general aggregate limit, it shall apply separately to this project in the amount of \$1,000,000. Products and completed operations aggregate shall be \$1,000,000. CGL insurance shall be written on an occurrence form and shall include bodily injury and property damage liability for premises, operations, independent contractors, products and completed operations, contractual liability, broad form property damage and property damage resulting from explosion, collapse or underground (x. c, u) exposures, personal injury and advertising injury. Damage to rented premises shall be included at \$100,000.

C. COMMERCIAL AUTOMOBILE LIABILITY INSURANCE:

Contractor shall maintain automobile liability insurance with a limit of not less than \$1,000,000 each accident for bodily injury and property damage liability. Such insurance shall cover liability arising out of any auto (including owned, hired and non-owned autos). The policy shall be endorsed to provide contractual liability coverage.

D. EVIDENCE OF INSURANCE:

Contractor shall, at its sole cost and expense, procure and maintain throughout the term of this Contract, Comprehensive General Liability and Worker's Compensation Insurance, including Employer Liability Insurance, with minimum policy limits of \$1,000,000 Combined Single Limits, or to the extent and in such amounts as required and authorized by Florida Law, and will provide endorsed Certification of Insurance generated and executed by a licensed insurance broker, brokerage or similar licensed insurance professional evidencing such coverage, and naming the County as a named, additional insured, as well as furnishing the County with a Certified Copy, or Copies, of said insurance policies. Certificates of Insurance and Certified Copies of these Insurance Policies must accompany this signed Contract. Said insurance coverage(s) procured by the Contractor as required herein shall be considered, and the Contractor agrees that said insurance coverage(s) it procures as required herein shall be considered, as primary insurance over and above any other insurance, or self-insurance, available to the County, and that any other insurance, or self-insurance available to the County shall be considered secondary to, or in excess of, the insurance coverage(s) procured by the Contractor as required herein.

Nothing herein shall be construed to extend the County's liability beyond that provided in Section 768.28, Florida Statutes.

In the event the insurance coverage expires prior to the completion of the project, a renewal

certificate shall be issued 30-days prior to said expiration date. The policy shall provide a 30-day notification clause in the event of cancellation or modification to the policy. All Certificates of Insurance must be on file with and approved by the County before the commencement of any work activities.

- 2. The Bidder's timely response under the terms of this Contract is paramount. The unavailability of the low bidder (depending on the urgency of the County's needs) may result in the award/project being authorized for the next low bidder.
- 3. Upon execution of the Contract and after the Notice to Proceed is issued by the County, the Contractor will begin work within TEN (10) CALENDAR DAYS unless otherwise provided. All work shall be complete within ONE HUNDRED TWENTY (120) CALENDAR DAYS from the date of the Notice to Proceed with an additional TWENTY (20) CALENDAR DAYS to allow time for County inspection and correction of deficiencies if noted for a total of ONE HUNDRED FORTY (140) CALENDAR DAYS from the date of the Notice to Proceed.
- **4.** The County may terminate this Contract at its convenience within 10 days advance written notice to the Contractor.
- 5. It is the responsibility of the bidder to contact the Purchasing Department prior to submitting a bid to ascertain if any addenda have been issued, to obtain all such addenda, and return executed addenda with the bid. Any questions relative to interpretation of requirements, scope of services or bid process shall be addressed in writing as indicated below. No inquires, if received within seven (7) days of the date set for the opening of bids, will be given consideration. Oral answers will not be authoritative.
- 6. DeSoto County, a political subdivision of the State of Florida, its officers, agents, employees, and volunteers are to be included as an additional Insured on both the Commercial General Liability and Commercial Automobile Liability. DeSoto County is to be named insured as DeSoto County Board of County Commissioners. Insurance policies meeting the requirements herein identified shall be maintained during the duration of the named project. Renewal certificates shall be sent to the County 30 days prior to any expiration date. There shall also be a 30 day notification to the County in the event of a cancellation or modification of any stipulated insurance coverage.
- 7. Certificates of insurance meeting the required insurance provisions shall be forwarded to the Purchasing Department upon Notice of Award, prior to commencement. For the purpose of identification, when submitting insurance, the bid name and number must be included on the certificate.

8. CONTRACTOR AND COUNTY DEFINED

As used in these specifications, the term "CONTRACTOR" refers to Seller and the term "COUNTY" refers to Purchaser, as defined in the terms and conditions applicable to this Contract. All person acting for Contractor, such as employees, subcontractors, and agents of the Contractor are included in the meaning of Contractor.

9. CONTRACTOR OBLIGATIONS

Contractor agrees to perform and complete the service described in the Bid Documents in accordance with the work requirements of this Contract and attached exhibits. Contractor shall

furnish all labor, supervision, equipment, and materials for the service. Experienced, qualified supervisors of the Contractor are essential to the satisfactory performance of the work. The County may consider lack of competent and capable supervision as grounds to reject a bid or terminate this Contract. An experienced, qualified supervisor should have approximately two years of experience doing the type of work requested in this Bid and one-year of experience supervising crews doing the type of work requested in this Bid. The County reserves the right to determine supervisory competence. Supervisors must be able to communicate fluently in English and in any language that crew members use to communicate.

10. ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Questions about the Contract and Technical portions of the bid must be submitted in writing to the person listed below. Bidders are cautioned that any statements made by the Contract and technical contact person that materially change any portion of the bid document shall not be relied upon unless subsequently ratified by a formal written addendum to the bid document. To find out whether the County intends to issue an addendum, contact the person listed below. No contract or technical question will be accepted after seven (7) day prior to the date set for bid opening.

The DeSoto County Engineering Division wishes to receive formal bids from Contractors for the Fiscal Year 23/24 Annual Paving Project and the Walt Brewer Sports Complex (Brewer Park) 2024 Asphalt Paving Project.

FY 23/24 ANNUAL PAVING SCOPE:

The Scope of Work includes the following seven (7) sites:

• Site 1: NE Childress Avenue

Approx. Paving Length: 0.51 miles

Limits: State Road 70 to End of Maintenance

Site 2: NE Forrest Avenue

Approx. Paving Length: 0.51 miles

Limits: State Road 70 to End of Maintenance

• Site 3: NW Sycamore Street

Approx. Paving Length: 0.38 miles

Limits: NW Eucalyptus Avenue to End of Maintenance

• Site 4: NW Myrtle Avenue

Approx. Paving Length: 1.38 miles

Limits: End of Maintenance to End of Maintenance

Site 5: SW Mariposa Avenue

Approx. Paving Length: 0.28 miles

Limits: US Highway 17 to End of Maintenance

• Site 6: SE Arthur Street

Approx. Paving Length: 0.78 miles

Limits: CR 763 to End of Maintenance

• Site 7: SW Dishong Avenue

Approx. Paving Length: 1.48 miles Limits: SW CR 760 to SW CR 661

All sites include maintenance of traffic, milling for transitions, varying depths of asphalt overlay as specified in the project plans and asphalt driveway turnouts. The project includes embankment and sod to be placed to correct drop-offs at the edge of the pavement. These items will be used at locations agreed upon with DeSoto County. The project also includes traffic striping (thermoplastic) where shown in the project plans. NE Childress Avenue (Site 1) and NE Forrest Avenue (Site 2) include work within the State Right-of-Way. An FDOT permit will be obtained by DeSoto County for this work prior to construction. The Contractor must adhere to FDOT requirements for work within their Right-of-Way.

BREWER PARK PAVING SCOPE:

The attached plans depict five (5) separate areas of roadway and parking lot paving and six (6) individual patches of the asphalt trail. The County's intention is to complete the trail work and then complete as much of the roadway and parking lot work as possible. The bid schedule includes the quantities needed to complete the trails and Road/Parking areas 1 through 3. Using the unit costs of

the bid, DeSoto County may adjust the quantities, limits or areas in order to maximize the funding without exceeding the budget.

ESTIMATE / BUDGET

The Engineer's Estimate for the 7 Annual Paving sites is \$989,823.45. The County budget for the FY 23/24 Annual Paving Project is \$1,000,000.00. DeSoto County may adjust the asphalt quantities to stay within the County budget if needed.

The Engineer's Estimate for the Brewer Park Project is \$288,576.97. The County budget for this project is \$250,000.00. If needed, the County will work with the low bidder to adjust project quantities so that the total is within the budget amount.

The basis of award is the lowest responsible, responsive bidder as calculated as a sum of both projects.

COUNTY NOTIFICATION

The Contractor is required to notify the County at least two (2) County business days prior to all work days. All work is to be performed between 8:00AM and 5:00PM, Monday through Friday and on non-County holidays.

TIME FRAME:

All work shall be complete within 120 calendar days of the Notice to Proceed. The total contract will be for 140 calendar days which will allow time for County inspection and correction of deficiencies if noted.

TS-01 MOBILIZATION/DEMOBILIZATION:

A. GENERAL:

Mobilization/Demobilization shall conform to the provisions of the FDOT Standard Specifications for Road and Bridge Construction (FDOT Specifications; Current Edition), Section 101, except as modified or amended herein. The work specified in this section consists of the preparatory work and operations in mobilizing for beginning work on the project, including, but not limited to, those operations necessary for the movement of personnel, equipment, sanitary facilities, supplies and incidentals to the project site, and for the establishment of on-site and off-site storage areas and other facilities as required by these specifications, State and Local laws and regulations. The costs of bonds, any required insurance, and any other pre-construction expense necessary for the start of the work, excluding the cost of construction materials, shall also be included in this section.

B. BASIS OF PAYMENT:

Payment for Mobilization/Demobilization shall be made under:

- 1. Bid Item 1.1 MOBILIZATION Lump Sum (LS)
- 2. Bid Item B1 MOBILIZATION Lump Sum (LS)

TS-02 MAINTENANCE OF TRAFFIC:

A. GENERAL:

The work in this section consists of maintaining traffic in the construction area to include all message boards, barricades, signing and flagging, and dust abatement. All Maintenance of Traffic (MOT) work shall conform to the applicable provisions of the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (MUTCD), FDOT Standard Specifications for Road and Bridge Construction – Section 102 (Current Edition) and the FDOT Standard Plans for Road Construction (Current Edition), except as modified or amended herein.

All roads shall be kept open to traffic during construction. The Contractor shall keep all State, County and Private Roads clean and safe at all times.

The Contractor shall repair any pavement markings damaged on any traveled road with the same material that existed prior to construction, as determined by the County. Any clean-up on traveled roads, or pavement marking repairs, shall be incidental to the MOT Bid Item.

Temporary detours of traffic and road closures shall not be permitted. Temporary signs are permitted as long as they are in conformance with the MUTCD.

The Contractor will not be permitted to isolate residences or businesses. Night work will not be allowed. The Contractor shall provide and maintain safe temporary approaches or crossings for intersections with roads, streets and trails, and entrances to businesses, parking lots, and residences.

Failure to comply with the requirements of this section will result in a demand for immediate cessation of all operations. Operations may not resume until County authorization has been provided.

B. TRAFFIC PLAN:

The Contractor shall submit a site specific MOT Plan at the Pre-construction Conference. Written approval of Plans must be granted prior to placement of MOT. Should the Contractor propose a modification to the approved MOT Plan, the modification must be submitted to the County a minimum of 10 days prior to construction for approval. The MOT Plan shall be prepared in accordance with FDOT Standard Plans for Road Construction (Current Edition).

When flashing arrow boards, variable message signs, portable traffic signals, or other special lighting devices are required in the Contractor's MOT Plan, as approved by the County; the costs for such items shall be included in the contract price for MOT and shall not be paid separately.

C. TRAFFIC CONTROL DEVICES & PROCEDURES:

The person who prepares the MOT Plan must have successfully completed the FDOT approved Training Course for Intermediate or higher – Work Zone Traffic Control. All flaggers must have successfully completed the FDOT approved Training Course for Basic – Work Zone Traffic Control and MOT. The Contractor shall provide a Traffic Technician, in lieu of a Worksite Traffic Supervisor, equipped with a vehicle and an adequate supply of signs, barricades, cones, stop/slow paddles, and flags for each operation. The Traffic Technician will be required to establish the proper work zone safety signage, traffic channelization devices, detours, and manned flagging positions, before any work begins and he must remain on site to supervise the operation and make any adjustments necessary, as directed by the County. All signing, channelization, or other traffic control operations will be in strict conformance with the approved MOT, MUTCD, and FDOT Specifications, Section 102.

D. METHOD OF MEASUREMENT:

The quantity for Maintenance of Traffic shall be one Lump Sum paid proportionately throughout the project. Maintenance of Traffic shall include all items, devices, materials, operations and all work as described herein, and as specified in FDOT Standard Specifications for Road and Bridge Construction – Section 102 (Current Edition).

E. BASIS OF PAYMENT:

Payment for Maintenance of Traffic shall be made under:

- 1. Bid Item 2.1 MAINTENANCE OF TRAFFIC Lump Sum (LS)
- 2. Bid Item B2 MAINTENANCE OF TRAFFIC Lump Sum (LS)

TS-03 ASPHALTIC CONCRETE SURFACE COURSE

A. GENERAL:

SCOPE: The work consists of the application of asphaltic concrete surface course which shall be composed of a mixture of (1) aggregate, (2) mineral filler, if necessary to produce

the desired stability hereinafter described, and (3) asphalt cement. The surface course shall be properly laid upon a prepared base in accordance with these specifications and Sections 331, 332 and 333 of the FDOT Specifications (2004 Edition), and in conformity with the lines, grades, thickness and typical cross section shown on the plans. This work shall include the conditioning of the existing surface or base.

RELATED TECHNICAL SPECIFICATIONS: FDOT Specifications shall mean the Florida Department of Transportation Standard Specifications for Road and Bridge Construction (2004 Edition) unless specifically noted otherwise.

QUALITY ASSURANCE: Asphalt extraction gradation shall be tested from grab samples collected once every 1800 square yards of asphalt delivered to the site, or a minimum of once per day.

B. PRODUCTS:

ASPHALT MIXES: Asphalt types shall be as specified in the plans and specifications. Only Types S-I, II, III and approved skid resistant types as described in Section 337, FDOT Specifications (2004 Edition), will be acceptable. For type II, however, the minimum stability shall be seven hundred and fifty (750) psi as determined by the Marshall Design Method. The flow shall be between 0.08 and 0.15 inches.

C. EXECUTION:

 GENERAL: The Contractor shall be responsible for temporary restoration of all roadway cuts and for maintaining all cuts in a drivable condition prior to final restoration. All settled areas shall be immediately refilled by the Contractor.

The Contractor shall be responsible for timely restoration, as determined by the County.

The Contractor shall give a written notice to the engineer at least 72 hours prior to commencement of resurfacing. If resurfacing will not be accomplished as a single operation, then individual notices shall be given for each section to be resurfaced.

The Contractor shall be responsible for the integrity of the Pavement Restoration for a minimum period of one year following the acceptance of the project.

2. SECONDARY ROAD CROSSINGS: Secondary road crossings which are open cut in areas where resurfacing is required shall be restored with a minimum of 12 inches of compacted limerock or shell base material or 8 inches of flowable fill when not prohibited by FDOT specifications.

Secondary road crossings made in unpaved and/or unsurfaced areas are to be restored in accordance with the details shown on the plans. Sufficient amount of approved material to be distributed on the roadway to provide a condition equal or greater than the condition of the road which existed prior to the commencement of construction.

3. COMPACTION AND TESTING: State, County and private road crossings which are open cut shall be compacted and tested as described herein.

Backfill below the road base material shall be compacted as shown on the Contract

Plans for trench restoration and subgrade.

- 4. APPROVALS: the work under this specification will not be considered complete or satisfactory until approved by the County as well as the applicable governmental agency.
- **5. CONSTRUCTION METHODS:** The mixture shall be spread only when the surface previously prepared is intact, firm properly cured and dried. Unless otherwise directed the following requirements shall also apply:

The spread shall occur only when the air temperature in the shade and away from artificial heat is above forty (40 F.) degrees Fahrenheit and rising. When the temperature in the shade and away from artificial heat is between forty (40 F.) degrees and sixty (60 F.) degrees Fahrenheit, the mixture shall be spread only when conditions are suitable.

The mixture shall be delivered on the road in ample time to permit the spreading, rolling and surface testing during daylight hours. The mixture shall be compacted to a minimum of ninety-five (95%) percent of the County's required compacted density.

The temperature of the mixture at the time of spreading shall be within thirty (30 F.) degrees Fahrenheit of the temperature set by the County for this stage of the operation. Temperatures thus set by the County shall be between two hundred fifty (250 F.) degrees Fahrenheit and three hundred and forty (340 F.).

Depressions which may develop after the initial rolling shall be remedied by loosening or removing the mixture laid and by adding new material to bring such depressions to a true surface. Such portions of the completed course that are defective in surface, compression or composition, or that do not comply with the requirements of these specifications, shall be taken up and replaced with suitable mixture properly laid in accordance with these specifications. All replacement work due to unsatisfactory surface course shall be performed at the Contractor's expense.

Joints to existing driveways, side streets, sidewalks, curbs and other permanent surfaces shall be made in a manner that results in a smooth transition to the existing surface while maintaining the minimum required thickness of asphalt. This is to be accomplished by milling or saw cutting as required, or in an alternative manner approved by the County. All milling shall be in accordance with FDOT Pay Item No. 327-70-1 and the FDOT's Standard Specifications for Road and Bridge Construction (Current Edition).

Refer to the Florida Department of Transportation Standard Specifications for Road and Bridge Construction current edition unless specifically noted otherwise.

6. FINISHED SURFACE REQUIREMENTS: For the purpose of testing the finished surface, the Contractor shall provide a fifteen (15') foot straight edge and a standard template cut to the true cross section of the road. These shall be available at all times during construction so that the County may check the finished surface. Vertical measurements from a string line between curbs to determine crown may be accepted as an alternate. The finished surface shall be such that it will not vary more than one-fourth (1/4") inch from the fifteen (15') foot straight edge applied parallel to the centerline of the pavement. Any irregularity of the surface exceeding the above limits

shall be corrected.

- **7. TESTS:** If deficiencies of the finished asphalt product are observed at any point during or following construction, any or all of the following test may be required by the County:
 - **a.** Determination of the job-mix formula.
 - **b.** Tests of the asphalt cement.
 - **c.** Sieve analysis of the aggregate.
 - **d.** Determination of the bitumen content of the asphaltic concrete.
 - **e.** Determination of density of finished asphaltic concrete pavement.
 - **f.** Determination of stability of finished asphaltic concrete pavement.
 - g. Plant inspection and verification of aggregate mix.

Any of the above tests as required by the County shall be paid for by the Contractor, including any retests.

D. METHOD OF MEASURMENT:

The quantity of Asphaltic Concrete shall be measured by the square yard in place at the thickness required in the plan set.

The quantity of Milling is lump sum item for all locations as noted in the plans.

E. BASIS OF PAYMENT:

The quantity, as determined above, shall include all cleaning and preparing of surfaces including but not limited to prime and tack coat for base courses, furnishing of all materials, the applications, curing and protection of all items, the furnishing of all tools, machines and equipment, and all incidental costs specified for Asphaltic Concrete Surface Course, as being covered under this section shall be paid accordingly. Payment for Asphaltic Concrete Surface Course is made under:

- **12.Bid Item B7** ASPHALT TYPE S-1 (1.5-INCH THICK ONE LIFT) (TRAIL PATCHES) Per Ton (TN)
- 13. Bid Item B8 18-INCH WIDE BUTT MILL Per Linear Feet (LF)

TS-04 PRIME AND TACK COAT FOR BASE COURSES

A. GENERAL:

1. SCOPE: This section includes applying bituminous material on a previously prepared base in accordance with these specifications and in conformity with the lines, grades, dimensions, and notes shown on the plans and in accordance with Section 300 of the Florida Department of Transportation Standard Specification for Road and Bridge Construction (2004 Edition), or as amended hereinafter. Prime/Tack shall be installed to all base material prior to Asphalt. Tack Coat shall be installed between all layers of Asphalt (existing and new).

B. PRODUCTS:

- 1. MATERIALS: For the prime and tack cost, any one of the following types or grades or prime and tack materials may be used at the option of the Contractor unless a particular type and grade are called for on the plans:
 - a. PRIME COAT.
 - (1) Cutback Asphalt, Grade RC-70 or RC-250.
 - (2) Emulsified Asphalt, Grade RS-2, SS-1, SS-1H or Special MS.
 - b. TACK COAT.
 - (1) Emulsified Asphalt, Grade S, RS-2, AE-90, SS-1, SS-1H or Special MS.

C. EXECUTION:

- **1. EQUIPMENT:** This work may be performed with any machines, combination of machines, or equipment that will produce the specified results.
- 2. CLEANING THE BASE: Before any bituminous material is applied, all loose material, dust, caked clay, and foreign materials which might prevent proper bond with existing surface shall be removed. Particular care shall be taken to clean the outer edges of the strip to be treated in order to insure that the tack cost will adhere. Where the prime tack coat is applied adjacent to curb and gutter or valley gutter, such concrete surfaces are to be protected and kept free of bituminous material.
- 3. WEATHER LIMITATIONS: No bituminous material shall be applied when the

temperature of the air is less than forty (40 F) degrees Fahrenheit in the shade, or when the weather conditions or the condition of the existing surface is unsuitable.

No bituminous material or concrete is to be placed during inclement weather such as rain.

- 4. APPLICATION OF PRIME COAT: The surface to be primed shall be clean and contain optimum moisture. For limerock bases, the glazed finish shall have been removed as specified. The temperature of the prime material shall be between one hundred (100 F.) degrees Fahrenheit and one hundred and fifty (150 F.) degrees Fahrenheit. The exact temperature shall be such as will insure uniform distribution. The material shall be applied by means of a pressure distributor. The amount of bituminous material applied shall be at the rate of approximately 0.10 to 0.25 gallons per square yard, dependent upon the type of base material. The rate of application shall be sufficient so as to coat the surface thoroughly and uniformly without having any excess to form pools or to flow off the base. A light, uniform application of clean sand shall be applied prior to opening the primed base to traffic. To cure the prime cost in such cases, the sand shall be rolled with a traffic roller in conjunction with traffic. If warranted by traffic conditions, the application shall be made only on onehalf (1/2) of the width of the base at one time, care being taken to secure the correct amount of bituminous material at the joint. The base shall be sufficiently moist in order to obtain maximum penetration of the asphalt.
- 5. APPLICATION OF TACK COAT: Where a bituminous surface is to be laid and a tack coat is required, both shall be applied as herein specified. On newly constructed base courses, the application of the tack coat (when one is required by engineer) shall follow the application of the prime coat, immediately before the wearing surface is applied. In general, a tack coat will not be required on primed bases, except in areas which have become excessively dirty and cannot be cleaned, or in areas where the prime has cured and lost bonding effect. The tack coat shall be applied with a pressure distributor. The bituminous material shall be heated to a suitable consistency as designated. The bituminous material shall be applied only in the amount necessary to bond the wearing surface to the base. The rate of application shall be between 0.02 and 0.08 gallons per square yard. The exact rate shall be designated by the engineer. The tack coat shall be applied sufficiently in advance of the wearing surface to permit drying. However, it shall not be applied so far in advance or over such an area as to lose its adhesiveness as a result of being covered with dust or other foreign material. The tack coat shall be kept free from traffic until the wearing surface is laid.

D. BASIS OF MEASUREMENT AND PAYMENT:

Work under this Section shall be considered as incidental to construction and no additional payment shall be made for the work or materials specified herein.

TS-05 EARTHWORK AND GRADING:

A. GENERAL:

1. SCOPE: The work included under this specification shall include furnishing all labor, tools, material and equipment to form existing base to grade the site to the lines and grade shown on the Plans and treatment of existing vegetation with herbicide and

vegetation removal.

B. PRODUCTS:

 MATERIALS: If the Contractor performs the finished grading, any supplemental base material needed to conform to the plan grades will be supplied by the County and stock piled onsite.

C. EXECUTION:

 The base shall be smoothed parallel to the proposed finished grades and elevations specified on the Plans. Vegetation on the existing base shall receive herbicide treatment and be removed.

D. BASIS OF MEASUREMENT AND PAYMENT:

Work under this Section shall be measure by the Square Yard.

E. BASIS OF PAYMENT:

The quantity, as determined above, shall include the grading of the existing base and any additional base supplied by DeSoto County to the grades and lines as shown in the Plans. Work also includes herbicide treatment of existing vegetation that has grown over the existing base and removal of said vegetation:

 Bid Item B3 – GRADING EXISTING MILLINGS/BASE MATERIAL (AREAS 1 THROUGH 3) – Per Square Yard (SY)

TS-06 ROAD BASE, SUB-BASE AND EMBANKMENT

A. GENERAL:

The work specified in this Section consists of construction of base course, sub-base courses and embankment material. Base and sub-base shall be consistent with FDOT Pay Item 285-706 Current Ed. (Optional Base Group 6). Embankment shall be consistent with FDOR Pay Item 120-6 Current Ed. All work shall conform to the FDOT Standard Specifications for Road and Bridge Construction (Current Edition).

B. METHOD OF MEASURMENT:

The County will measure the quantity of Optional Base Group 6 and embankment installed, compacted in place:

- 1. Shell Road Base is measured in Cubic Yard installed, compacted, in-place.
- **2.** Embankment is measured in Cubic Yard, installed, compacted, in-place.

C. BASIS OF PAYMENT:

The quantity, as determined above, shall include all preparation, placement of material compacted, grading and prep for surface courses in accordance with the Plan Set and FDOT Standard Specifications for Road and Bridge Construction (Current Edition).

- 1. Bid Item 5.1 SHELL ROAD BASE (LBR 100) Per Cubic Yard (CY)
- 2. Bid Item 5.2 EMBANKMENT FOR DROP-OFF CORRECTION Per Cubic Yard

TS-07 SOD

A. GENERAL:

The work specified in this Section consists of sod as required by the plan set and as necessary to restore any areas damaged by the Contractor. All work under this scope shall be consistent with FDOT Pay Item 570-1-2 - Performance Turf- Sod. All work shall conform to the FDOT Standard Specifications for Road and Bridge Construction (Current Edition). All sod shall be Bahia.

B. METHOD OF MEASURMENT:

The County will measure the area of sod in-place:

- 1. Sod will be measured as the square yardage in place.
- Any areas disturbed by the contractor which are not required to be sodded to accommodate the proposed improvements shall be sodded at the expense of the Contractor. No additional compensation will be given for restoration of damaged areas.

C. BASIS OF PAYMENT:

- 1. Bid Item 6.1 SOD Per Square Yard (SY)
- 2. Bid Item B SOD Per Square Yard (SY)

TS-08 SIGNING AND PAVEMENT MARKINGS

A. GENERAL:

This work shall consist of all labor, materials, equipment and supervision necessary to layout and install all pavement markings. All work shall be in accordance with FDOT Specifications Section 711 for Thermoplastic Pavement Markings and Section 710 for Painted Pavement Markings as required by Plans, FDOT Standards and the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (MUTCD) as determined by the County Inspector. The Contractor shall conform to FDOT Standard Plans for Road and Bridge Construction for Pavement Striping.

The painting over unacceptable or incorrect striping will not be accepted or allowed. Once the obliteration of unacceptable or incorrect striping has been accepted by the County, the Contractor shall place the correct striping and/or marking.

B. METHOD OF MEASURMENT:

The County will measure the quantity of Traffic Striping and Markings once the final striping and marking is complete for a roadway. The quantity to be paid under this section

shall be as follows:

1. The net length, in linear feet, of each of the various types of painted line, stripe and bands authorized, completed and acceptable applied.

C. BASIS OF PAYMENT:

The quantity, as determined above, shall include all cleaning and preparing of surfaces, furnishing of all materials, the applications, curing and protection of all items, the furnishing of all tools, machines and equipment, and all incidental costs specified for Signing & Pavement Markings, as being covered under this section shall be paid accordingly. Payment for Signing & Pavement Markings is made under:

TS-09 EROSION AND SEDIMENT CONTROL

A. GENERAL:

The work specified in this Section consists of the required erosion and sediment control devises as needed to prevent erosion from the construction area for entering offsite properties, culvert pipes, wetlands/surface waters and other environmentally sensitive areas. All work under this scope shall be consistent with FDOT Pay Item 104-10-3 - Sediment Barriers. All work shall conform to the FDOT Standard Specifications for Road and Bridge Construction (Current Edition).

The Plan Set shows required erosion and sediment contract devices to be implemented

throughout the job. It is the responsibility of the Contractor to ensure that sediment is not transported from the job site to the areas listed above. Additional erosion and sediment control devices maybe required to prevent sediment from leaving the work area and where necessary, shall be installed by the Contract at no additional cost to the County.

All erosion and sediment control devices must be in place and inspected by the County before beginning construction. 



EMPLOYMENT AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT made and entered into this <u>14th</u> day of <u>May</u>

<u>2024</u>, by and between DESOTO COUNTY, a political subdivision of the State of Florida, acting by and through the DeSoto Count y Board of County Commissioners, 201 E. Oak Street, Arcadia, Florida 34266, hereinafter referred to as (Employer), and <u>Jeffrey Phipps</u> hereinafter referred to as (Employee).

1. EMPLOYMENT

The Employer hereby employs, engages and hires the Employee as Environmental Services Director. Employee is an "at will" employee and as such works at the pleasure of the County Administrator.

2. BEST EFFORTS OF EMPLOYEE

Employee agrees that he/she will at all times faithfully, industriously, and to the best of his or her ability, experience and talents, perform all of the duties that may be required of and from him/her pursuant to the express and implicit terms of the Agreement to the reasonable satisfaction of Employer.

3. TERM OF EMPLOYMENT

- a. The term of this Agreement commences on May 18, 2024. Employee agrees to remain in the exclusive employ of DeSoto County, and to neither accept nor to become employed by any other employer while serving DeSoto County, except as may otherwise be approved by the County Administrator.
- b. Employee's service shall be reviewed by the County Administrator in accordance with the Personnel Policies of DeSoto County.

c. Nothing in this Agreement shall prevent or otherwise interfere with the right of the Employer to evaluate the performance of the Employee at any time, and to continue or terminate the service of the Employee at any time.

4. COMPENSATION AND BENEFITS

- a. Employer agrees to pay Employee for his/her services rendered pursuant hereto an annual salary of \$67,000.00 , payable weekly at the same time other employees of Employer are paid.
- b. Employee is entitled to the following benefits as part of his/her employment with DeSoto County.
 - 1) Health Care: "Employee only" coverage paid by the County, effective per current Health Plan wait period.
 - 2) Vacation:
 - Seven (7) days the first year;
 - Ten (10) days beginning the second year through the fifth year;
 - Fifteen (15) days beginning the sixth year through the tenth year; and
 - Twenty (20) days the beginning of the eleventh year.
 - 3) Sick Leave: Two (2) hours per week.
 - 4) Retirement Membership in the Florida Retirement System in the Senior Management Service Class (SMSC) if position is designated; otherwise in the Regular Class.
 - 5) Pay Increases:
 - Cost of living increases or any other pay increases that are approved by the Board and apply to all County employees;
 - Merit increases at the discretion of the Administrator within budgeted amounts, not to exceed 10% per year.

6) Workers Compensation, FICA (Employer Matching), Unemployment Compensation and Florida Retirement Plan (Employer Contribution) will all be paid by the County.

5. PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

- a. The County may pay for Employee's annual membership cost for up to two (2) professional organizations.
- b. The County will pay for the cost of out of County travel when traveling on County business which includes attendance at conferences, seminars, etc., which are for professional development.

6. SEVERANCE

- a. In the event Employee voluntarily resigns his/her position, Employee shall not be entitled to severance pay. However, Employee shall receive accumulated annual leave and fifty percent (50%) of his/her accumulated sick leave up to a maximum of two hundred (200) hours.
- b. If Employee is asked to resign or is terminated, he/she will receive thirty(30) working days of severance pay in addition to all accumulated annual leave and fifty percent (50%) of unused sick leave up to a maximum of two hundred (200) hours.
- c. If Employee retires, he/she will receive all accumulated annual leave and fifty percent (50%) of accumulated sick leave up to a maximum of two hundred (200) hours.
- d. If employee is convicted of a crime, he/she will be terminated, no severance benefits will be paid and all accumulated annual and sick leave will be forfeited.

7. NOTICE OF RESIGNATION

Employee is required to provide the County Administrator with sixty (60) days written notice of resignation. The Count y Administrator may accept less notice time if it is determined that less notice would not adversely affect the County. However, if Employee fails to provide the required sixty days notice and the Administrator does not accept less than the sixty days notice, the Employee will not be entitled to receive any severance or accumulated leave benefits, but shall receive a final pay check.

8. BENEFITS IN CASE OF EXTENDED ILLNESS

In addition to being eligible for the County Sick Leave Sharing, the County Administrator may propose to the Board extension of benefits for Employee for a specified period of time. The recommendation will list the specific benefits requested and the time frame for the request.

9. EMPLOYMENT STATUS

In addition to the fact that the Employee works at the pleasure of the County Administrator and is an "at will" employee, the Administrator may elect to place Employee on a leave with pay or without pay for a specified period of time. If Employee is placed on leave with pay status, he/she will continue to receive all benefits and pay as they were prior to being placed on the leave with pay status. If Employee is placed on a leave without pay status, he/she will continue to receive all benefits he/she received prior to his/her status change with the exception of being paid.

10. MODIFICATION OF POLICY

If the Board modifies the Employment Policy Affecting Director Positions, Employee agrees that this contract is subject to and shall be amended to conform to such modifications.

11. INDEMNIFICATION

The Employer shall defend, save harmless and indemnify the Employee against any actions, in tort or if he/she is named in his/her capacity as Environmental Services Director as a party defendant in any action for any injury or damage suffered as a result of any act, event or omission of action in the scope of his/her duties or function, unless he/she acted in bad faith or with malicious purpose or in a manner exhibiting wanton and willful disregard of human rights, safety, or property. The Employer shall not be liable in tort for the acts or omissions of the Employee committed while acting outside the course and scope of his/her agreed duties or committed in bad faith or with malicious purpose or in a manner exhibiting wanton and willful disregard of human rights, safety or property. Employer shall have the right to settle and compromise claims brought against Employee in his/her official capacity.

12. CONTROLLING LAW

This Agreement is to be governed by the laws of the State of Florida. The venue for any litigation resulting out of this Agreement shall be in DeSoto County, Florida.

13. EXTENT OF AGREEMENT

This Agreement represents the entire integrated agreement between the Employer and Employee and supersedes all prior negotiations, representations or agreements, either written or oral. This Agreement may only be amended, supplemented, modified, changed or cancelled by a duly executed written instrument.

Ambulance accounts that have been unable to be collected by the collection agency for fiscal year 2021-2022.

BACKGROUND:

This year Desoto County Fire Rescue provided 3,289 billable ambulance transports and collected \$1,133,809.94 in payments. All uncollectible patient accounts greater than one-hundred twenty (120) days are written off each year and forwarded to the collection agency, UFMS, Inc. for further collection efforts. The total uncollectible balance during the fiscal year 2021-2022 is \$494,418.40. The collection agency, United Financial collected \$29,175.53 in bad debts during the fiscal year. This left a total of \$465,242.87 in uncollected bad debts in fiscal year 2021-2022.
